Frequently Asked Questions

Administrative Offices: The La Crosse Speedway office is located just outside the main grandstand entrance.

Alcoholic Beverages: We will not serve beer to anyone under the legal drinking age, or to anyone who is deemed intoxicated. Proper identification must be presented, and please drive responsibly!

Automobile Assistance: Fans who encounter car trouble while visiting La Crosse Speedway may receive assistance. Please contact a Speedway staff member for assistance.

Carry-Ins: Carry in food and beverages are not permitted inside the gate (except items purchased from the food vendors adjacent to the entrance).

Concessions: The main concession stands are located at the top of the grandstand area on the frontstretch.

Credit Cards: Credit Card are accepted at all ticket windows and the pit registration.

Family Section: The family seating sections are located at the end of the frontstretch, in front of the burger grill area, past the start finish line. Alcohol is not permitted in these areas.

Golf Carts / ATV's: May I bring my golf cart or ATV to use on the grounds? Yes, you may, but there is a fee for a permit and rules to use. Please visit OktoberfestRaceWeekend.com for details.

Handicap Access: The grandstands have designated wheelchair accessibility. On the west end, in the elevated grandstands are wheelchair designated spots. The speedway's handicap parking is located just outside the grandstand playground on the north end of the east parking lot. Please display handicap credentials in your vehicle.

Lost and Found: Lost & found items may be taken to, and retrieved from at Souvenir Stand.

Paging: The public address system at the Speedway will be used for paging fans in emergency situations only. Bring your cellular phone to find your friends or family members.

Parking: Car parking is free for all spectators, in the proper parking areas (Please do not park in the Camping Areas).

Rain Checks: In the event of postponement, your ticket will be honored on the date the event is rescheduled. During Oktoberfest many logistics come into play, but decisions are made keeping all parties involved in mind. Sorry, no cash refunds.

Re-Entry: Fans who leave the race track grandstands must have their hand stamped upon departure and have proper wristband on / or ticket stub in hand for re-admission.

Restrooms: Restrooms are located at the center of the frontstretch concession area. There are limited portable restrooms available in turn one and on the west end of the grandstand areas.

Security: If you have any problems, emergencies, etc., find a security staff member, or contact a concession worker.

Smoking: Wisconsin State Smoking Ordinance prohibits smoking in any of the seating. Smoking is allowed behind grandstand seating area only.

Souvenirs: The Speedway souvenir stand during the Oktoberfest Race Weekend is located across from the Ticket Entrance.





ARCA Midwest Tour Oktoberfest 200

The 200 lap Oktoberfest 200 ARCA Midwest Tour race is the “Granddaddy of the end of year special events”. This, tough, competitive and grueling race has separated Champions from Challengers since its inception in 1970. To win this event and be crowned the “Oktoberfest Champion”, is a highlight of any Drivers (and race teams) career. The list of past winners’ is impressive, and those that have competed in it even more so. For this year’s event:

Sunday Oct. 9th - ARCA Midwest Tour

WHOME TO KEEP AN EYE ON: Any past winners, and current ARCA Midwest Point leader Casey Johnson. Plus, any other “Top Guns” from other national series.

FORMAT: 200 laps with up to two “controlled pit stops”. A controlled pit stop allows the teams to re-fuel, change tires and make adjustments under yellow flag conditions for a set number of laps (usually 4). This helps the teams reduce cost by not having to need a full crew for any pit stop.

GETTING IN: Qualifying will take the top 16, Qualifying races will fill another 4 spots, last chance race(s) 4 spots, the current AMWT point leader, the most current Trickle 99 winner, the most current Oktoberfest winner, and promoters’ choice(s) if needed.

LAST EVENT: Saving the best for last...the 200 lapper is the last event of the weekend.





The Original Trickle 99



The Dick Trickle 99 began as a concept that ARTGO and LaCrosse Speedway promoter John McKarns discovered from a track named “Thunder Road” out in the North East, using a similar format, first run in 2007.

A race, divided into three segments with not only segment lineup formulas, but an overall winner was not only something fun for the fans to watch, but something fun for the racers to compete in. No pressure for drivers looking for championship series points. Just a one night race, honoring the legend Dick Trickle. Trickle never raced in the event in his name, but he was on hand for several years to welcome the drivers competing, and to congratulate the winner.

FRIDAY, OCT. 8 • Super Late Models • “Dick Trickle 99”

OPEN TO ANY SUPER LATE MODEL TEAM:

FORMAT: Fastest 15 in Qualifying advance to 99 Lap Feature. 10-Lap Last Chance(s) If two last chances, top three advance. If Three Last Chances, top two advance. Points are assigned for each segment based upon your finishing position. First would be 1 point, second 2 points, etc..

THE RACE IS RUN IN 3 SEGMENTS: Each segment are 33 laps long.

Segment 1 is lined up with an 6 to 10 car inversion (dice roll) from qualifying.

Segment 2 is lined up by inverting 10 plus draw of the first segment (must be on lead lap). Segment 3 is lined up by inverting 10 plus draw of current points (must be on lead lap)!

OVERALL LOWEST SCORE IS THE CHAMPION!

The Stars and Cars

• SUPER LATE MODELS •



ARCA MIDWEST TOUR SUPER LATE MODELS – The ARCA Midwest Tour has cars made specifically for racing short tracks, built with high-performance suspension parts and engines (A.K.A. “Super Late Model”). This division is run similar to the old ARTGO series that competed in the 80’s and 90’s. The rules package is designed to meet in the middle, allowing drivers throughout the region to make minimal to no changes to their cars in order to race.



The Original “DICK TRICKLE 99” SUPER LATE MODELS -

This race for the Super Late Models is one of the most popular short track events. This is the “big one” for the cars that do not usually run with the touring Late Models. Great variety of cars and talent. A lot....a lot of pride to win this one. The unique part of the Trickle 99 is the race format. The race is split up into three

33 lap segments with a different lineup format for each segment. Overall winner has the lowest total of “scored points.”



THE FUTURES SUPER LATE MODELS - A tough, no holds barred race for the young Stars of the Super Late Models. Restricted to an age limit and can not have won the Oktoberfest race. It is an opportunity to show case the talent of the up and comers of the sport. Look for some solid racing throughout the entire field. The racing is fast, furious and awesome.

THE KNIGHTS OF OKTOBERFEST – This is new Super Late Model event for teams that can not run in the Futures. It is a test of skill, patience, and team work. Many of the Super Late Model teams will be trying to prove they are contenders for either Fridays Trickle 99 race or the big one the Oktoberfest 200 on Sunday. Should be a fun race to watch...not a lot of laps...so teams got to go from the wave of the green flag.



• SPORTSMEN •



MID-AMERICAN STOCK CAR SERIES – The Mid-American Stock Cars series is the longest running Sportsmen style car series in the Midwest. It has been the staple for most year end special events. The series started in 1993 and it is based on a GM Metric framed cars, with aftermarket made-for-racing Sportsman bodies. Engines are 358 cubic inch Chevrolet and Ford or 366 cubic inch V-8 Mopars. They must run a stock Holley 750 CFM Carburetor, 8” Hoosier race tires and weigh a minimum of 3000 pounds.



AREA SPORTSMEN – Area Sportsmen starts with O.E.M. stock-type bodies, stubs and frames, with a minimum wheelbase of 108”. You may see many of these as a middle support class at short tracks in Wisconsin, Minnesota, and Illinois. They compete on treaded 8” wide racing tires.



LACROSSE SPORTSMEN – For the last three years, the LaCrosse Sportsmen have a “break out” time of 22.000 seconds. This rule allows a variety of cars including Sportsmen, Mid-Am, Modifieds, Trucks, Vintage and more to compete under one class. Teams can utilize any treaded Hoosier Tire that fits on an 8” wheel. You will see a variety of cars and it is a unique way to race. But, the racing has been outstanding. Look for lot’s of passing and a new type of game plan to run in the race. Drivers get two Mulligan per race (between 21.600-21.999) as long as it is not on the last lap.

MIDWEST TRUCKS– The Midwest Truck Series has been providing fans with some good ol’ fashioned hard charging racing. The series has seen growth and is real testing ground for skill and team work. This series will provide some of the best racing of the weekend. You will enjoy this Division!



• LATE MODELS •



LACROSSE LATE MODELS – The LaCrosse Late Models compete at the LaCrosse Speedway weekly, sanctioned by NASCAR. They run any approved ABC Late Model body, and they run on Hoosier 1070 10” race tires. Engines may not exceed 363 cubic inches and they may only run a 2-barrel 500 CFM Carburetor. They race weekly at LaCrosse from early May through mid August, plus the Oktoberfest Race Weekend finale. Again, this year they will run 4 feature events to determine the LaCrosse Fairgrounds Speedway Champion, right here at Oktoberfest.

BIG-8 LATE MODELS – One of the top Midwest touring series by establishing the home track as the basis for the cars that participate. Solid car counts and great racing with the “local” cars versus the “outsiders”. The cars run on a Hoosier 8” treaded tire, and the engines are restricted on horsepower. This class gives the weekly short track warrior a chance to race specials at other tracks without interfering with their home track weekly racing schedule.

GANDRUD CHEVROLET CRATEOBERFEST CHALLENGE – The mixing and matching of a multitude of race cars from all walks of life will be on display Sunday afternoon with one of the participants taking home a brand new 602 Crate Engine from Gandrud Chevrolet and GM Performance. Race fans can expect to see racing machines such as Trucks, Mid-American Stock Cars, Sportsmen, 602 Late Models, Modifieds and more, all utilizing the popular 602 crate engine package to chase the checkered flag, and a brand new engine in victory lane.

CAMPING RULES & REGULATIONS

- **PARKING:** One Camper per designated reserved camping stall. All camping is classified as "primitive" camping. Porta-Jons and trash removal are provided.
- **RESERVED:** The majority of all camping on the grounds is reserved in advance. Reserved spaces are indicated by white paint on grass.
- **UNRESERVED:** The only area that is open free camping is the far southwest end of the entire grounds. Those areas are on a first-come, first-parked basis. You may only save space for one other camping unit beside yours, outside the reserved area - until 6pm Thursday. Officials reserve the right to remove any ropes or tape put up around empty spaces at any time. Campground roads and boundaries will be marked with paint. Please stay within the confines of the area near your unit. Unreserved campers MUST all park in an east-west direction, per fire marshal and the LaCrosse County Health Department Camping Permit.
- **PLEASE LIMIT DRIVING VEHICLES INSIDE** the campground to one per space. The camping area is NOT a parking lot.
- **QUIET HOURS:** Campground quiet hours will be enforced - 1:00 am to 6:00 a.m., as a courtesy to everyone. Please limit generator noise & use during quiet hours. NO Loud music, etc during quiet hours. Security has the authority to ask any person or groups of individuals who are abusing the quiet hour policy to leave. Permission is also granted to remove any pit or grandstand wristband because of violator's conduct.
- **NO CAMPING AREAS:** No Camping allowed within the center of the East spectator parking lot (Gravel lot off Cty. Rd Mt). That area is reserved for **CAR PARKING**. Both sides of the lot - east and west are reserved camping. Also Camping is not permitted in designated HAULER PARKING LOTS unless approved by camping or speedway officials.
